How to Write an Artist Statement

What is an Artist Statement?

An Artist Statement is a brief and general introduction to your work, a body of work, or a specific project. An artist writes an Artist Statement to reveal their thoughts about the creative process, the purpose of the artwork, and the influences on their artwork. Artist Statements provide the artist with an opportunity to communicate with an audience. Put simply: “Your Artist Statement speaks for your art when you are not there to.”

How to Write an Artist Statement

Helpful Tips:

- * Write in first person, present tense: "I am" & "I do" NOT "I was" & "I did"
- * Write as if you were talking to someone about your artwork
- * Write 3 paragraphs and in full sentences (100 words maximum)
- * Include an introduction, body, and conclusion
- * Use your own words and make it personal
- * Keep it short, sweet, and attention-grabbing

Sample Artist Statement:

"My artwork takes a critical view of social, political and cultural issues. Often referencing American history, my work explores the relationships between popular culture and fine art. My work reproduces familiar visual and aural signs, arranging them into new conceptually layered installations. Although there may not always be material similarities between the different projects they are linked through the subject matter. The subject matter of each body of work determines the materials and the forms of the work. Each project often consists of multiple works, in a range of different media, grouped around specific themes and meanings."
