at

Woodstock

City Hall

Cost:

\$282.50 taxes included for the use of Council Chambers and the officiate. A non-refundable deposit of \$141.25 taxes included is required upon booking. (*This fee does not include the cost of the marriage licence*)

Where:

Marriage ceremonies will take place in Council Chambers at Woodstock City Hall 500 Dundas Street.

Officiate

The City Clerk or Deputy Clerk, will perform civil ceremonies on Mondays and Fridays only between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. or between 2:00 p.m. and 3:30 p.m.

Witnesses:

You must provide your own witnesses for the ceremony. There is no minimum age requirements for a witness, however, it is suggested they should be at least sixteen (16) years of to be able to understand and appreciate what is taking place and if necessary give evidence of such at a later date if required.

If you are unable to provide witnesses the Clerks department will help provide witnesses for you at a cost of \$56.50 taxes included

Music:

If you would like music you must provide the music, the equipment and the person to start and stop the music.

Guests:

Please contact Woodstock City Hall for current seating capacity. 519-539-1291

Decorations:

Woodstock City Hall has floral arrangements that will be in place prior to your ceremony.

NO other decorations will be allowed. Flowers for yourself, attendants and guests will be your responsibility.

Rehearsals

Rehearsals will **not** be offered.

Ceremonies available:

You may choose one (1) of the three (3) ceremonies that are available.

Additional services

Woodstock Council Chambers is wheelchair accessible, the elevator is accessed through the Reeve Street entrance.

The City of Woodstock will do it's best to accommodate accessibility requests as per the Accessibility Standards for Customer Service. Please discuss your needs with the receptionist at the time of booking.

Applicants must provide their own language interpreter if one or both applicants do not speak and/or understand English. The interpreter cannot be one of the witnesses and the interpreter will be required to sign a form confirming the wedding ceremony has been represented accurately

Marriage License Information

Cost - \$125.00 cash or debit only (as of January 01, 2021)

ID Required

2 pieces for each applicant and one of those pieces for each must be photo ID

- Government-issued birth certificate, including any change of name certificates
- Valid passport
- Record of immigrant landing
- Canadian Citizenship Card
- Valid Driver's Licence
- Valid Ontario Photo Card

Valid

The marriage license is valid for 90 days from the date of issue. If your marriage licence expires you will be required to purchase a new licence. Extensions or refunds cannot be issued.

Documents required if divorced

If Divorced in Canada

- The final decree
- The final judgement
- A Certificate of Divorce

If Divorced outside of Canada

If you were divorced outside of Canada, you will need to provide certain documents to prove that you are no longer married. The government needs to validate these documents. This process can take up to 4 weeks.

For Additional information regarding Divorced out of Canada please call the Office of the Registrar General 1-800-461-2156 (toll-free).

You will need to forward the following documents to Service Ontario:

- **marriage licence application form:** completed and signed
- **statement of sole responsibility:** for each divorce (signed by both people who are planning to get married and a witness)
- **legal opinion letter:** from an Ontario lawyer, addressed to both people who plan to get married, giving reasons why the divorce or annulment should be recognized in Ontario
- **divorce decree or annulment:** an original or court-certified copy in English or French. If the decree is in another language, you will need to include a translated copy and an affidavit sworn by a certified translator

Wait Time

Once you have brought in your application or completed the online form, staff will review your application for completeness, take copies of your identification and supporting documents and process your fee. The license is usually ready the next business day. It is important to know who will be picking up and signing to accept the license.

Marriage Solemnization Ceremony No. 1

Bold means the words spoken by the municipal representative.

Person No. 1

This couple has come here today to be joined in marriage, which is the voluntary union of two persons to the exclusion of all others. If any person can show just cause why they may not be lawfully joined together, let them speak now or forever hold their peace. (Municipal Clerk) to Person No. 1: Repeat after me, please:

“I (state your name) do solemnly declare that I do not know of any lawful impediment why I may not be joined in matrimony to (state person no. 2’s name)”

(Municipal Clerk) to Person No. 2: Repeat after me, please:

“I (state your name) do solemnly declare that I do not know of any lawful impediment why I may not be joined in matrimony to (state person no. 1’s name)”

Marriage is not a single event but rather a developing process which is not to be undertaken recklessly or irresponsibly but rather maturely and honestly. Marriage is the faithful union between two persons the result of which is the formation of a family unit whose members shall help, support and enjoy each other in good times and in bad times. It is this relationship these two persons wish to have declared and celebrated.

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
If a double ring ceremony the 2nd person repeats the above.

3. The applicants shall be responsible for the conduct and supervision of all persons admitted to the Council Chambers and shall see that all regulations pertaining to the event are strictly followed.
4. Changes to the date and time will be allowed at no additional charge provided that Council Chambers and the officiate are available.
5. A wedding booking will be confirmed after this agreement is completed and returned to the Clerk's office with full non refundable deposit by cash or Interact.
6. The balance owing will be paid for in full prior to the ceremony being conducted.
