Article 1 – Interpretation

635.1.1 Tag day - defined

“tag day” means and includes any undertaking by which funds are solicited on any street, highway or other municipal property in the City of Woodstock for any lawful purpose.

Article 2 - General Provisions

635.2.1 Solicitation - on tag days - approval - required

No person or organization shall be permitted to solicit contributions of money on the streets, highways or other municipal property in the City of Woodstock without first having obtained an approval from the Clerk or his or her designate.

635.2.2 Eligibility

The Clerk shall only have authorization to grant approval on City property and to set parameters on the location and times to charitable or non profit organizations.

635.2.3 Tag days - one annually

An organization may conduct only one event per year.

635.2.4 Police - notified - of event

The organization, once approved by the Clerk or designate to conduct the event, shall notify the Oxford Community Police Services prior to the event.

Article 3 - Enforcement

635.3.1 Fine - for contravention

Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Chapter is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine or penalty as provided in the *Provincial Offences Act*.

635.3.2 Separate offence - daily

Each day a violation of this Chapter continues shall constitute a separate and distinct offence under this Chapter.

Article 4 – Repeal – Enactment

635.4.1 By-law - previous

All previous by-laws relating to this subject are hereby repealed.

635.4.2 Effective date

The by-law upon which this Chapter is founded came into force and took effect upon the final passing thereof. By-law 8017-04, July 15, 2004.
