Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Cedar Creek and Southside Park Pond Notice of Completion

A Municipal Class Environmental Assessment was completed to allow for the improvement of fish habitat potential and to address water quality issues on Cedar Creek and Southside Park Pond. The City of Woodstock is proposing to restore Cedar Creek within the vicinity of Southside Park using the principles of 'Natural Channel Design' following the concept of Alternative '5' of the Environmental Assessment Study for the Cedar Creek portion of the study. The proposed alterations to Southside Pond includes dredging, installation of a forebay, fish passage and other enhancements following the concept of Alternative '3' of the Class Environment Assessment Study for the Southside Pond portion of the study.

The above study is being conducted in accordance with the requirements for Schedule "B" projects as described in the Municipal Engineers Association's "Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA)" document (October 2000 as amended in 2011). Subject to comments received as a result of this notice, and the receipt of necessary approvals, the City of Woodstock intends to proceed with the design and implementation of this project. Construction could begin in early 2015.

A screening report has been prepared documenting the planning process and recommendations. The report is available on the City's website and at the following locations:

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Interested persons can provide written comment to the municipality on the screening report within 30 calendar days from the date of issue of this Notice. Comments can be directed to the City Engineer.

If concerns arise from this study that cannot be resolved in discussion with the municipality, a person or party may request that the Minister of the Environment make an order for the study to comply with part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order) which addresses individual environmental assessments. Requests must be received by the Minister at the address below within 30 calendar days of this Notice. A copy of the request must also be sent to the City Engineer. If there are no requests, the proposed works will proceed to design as presented in the planning documentation.
