- a year-round resident of Woodstock
- feeds on tree buds, seeds, and some insects

Where it's been found in Woodstock:

- a regular visitor to bird feeders, parks, and city trails

Black-capped Chickadee

- a year-round resident of Woodstock
- feeds on seeds, spiders and insects

Where it's been found in Woodstock:

- a regular visitor to bird feeders. Can easily be seen in shrubby areas in parks and along trails

- a year-round resident of Woodstock
- feeds on seeds and insects

Where it's been found in Woodstock:

- a regular visitor to bird feeders. Found near water and shrubby areas where they nest
